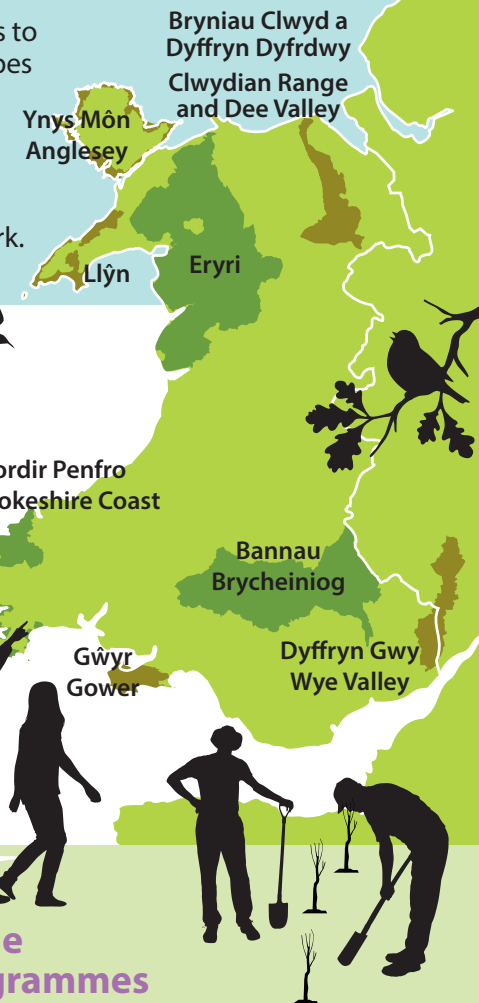




Tirweddau Cymru Landscapes Wales

Designated Landscapes are exemplars in responding to the climate and nature emergency; where a people-focused approach ensures all voices are represented and all radical action is taken collaboratively.

About us Tirweddau Cymru Landscapes Wales is a partnership of the five AONBs in Wales: Anglesey, Clwydian Range and Dee Valley, Llŷn Peninsula, Gower, and Wye Valley; and the three Welsh National Park Authorities: Bannau Brycheiniog, Eryri and Pembrokeshire Coast National Park.

Sustainable Landscapes Sustainable Places has provided **£11.7 million** to support a **three-year programme** running in the eight Welsh Designated Landscapes.

The Sustainable Landscapes, Sustainable Places fund is supporting action across the eight designated landscapes focussed on

Accelerating decarbonisation

Promoting biodiversity and nature recovery

Supporting resilient and green communities

Delivering Sustainable tourism



Between 2022 and 2025 the fund is supporting:

6 programmes accelerating decarbonisation

including:

- Sustainable community transport and EV charging
- Supporting community led activity on decarbonisation
- Fitting new lighting to reduce energy use and help improve nocturnal wildlife
- Taking co-ordinated action to reduce energy use within organisations, based on evidence from comprehensive surveys and analysis in 2022
- Upgrading IT and grid infrastructure

13 programmes promoting biodiversity and nature recovery including:

- Targeted species and habitat work, improving connectivity and resilience
- Habitat creation and management, including tree planting and marine habitat creation of seagrass meadows
- Control of Invasive Non Native Species (INNS)
- Developing our own tree nurseries to support planting of native species,
- Creating and managing traditional field boundaries
- A Wales wide focus on improving and communicating on our nocturnal biodiversity
- Restoring and protecting peatland

6 programmes supporting resilient and green communities including:

- Community funds available to support action on nature, climate, energy, and recreation in Designated Landscapes
- Supporting outdoor learning and enjoyment through improved access and facilities
- Community allotment spaces
- Improving and decarbonising community spaces
- The development of an education programme, linked to the curriculum, increasing awareness of our Designated Landscapes

7 sustainable tourism programmes including:

- Improving access and recreation opportunities, including improved footpaths and access routes
- Visitor interpretation and education facilities
- Master planning for more sustainable future transport to and within Designated Landscapes
- Upgrading visitor and community amenities including car parks and sustainable toilets
- Improving cultural heritage and other key visitor sites

Sustainable Landscapes, Sustainable Places is a Welsh Government capital fund for Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and National Parks.
